God is doing something Newin Us

Exploring paths of deepening Faith

"Remember not the events of the past. The things of long ago consider not. See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:18-19

What a bold proclamation, this prophecy of Isaiah. Indeed, it may be so bold, so brash, as to be nearly unbelievable. Yet, it is true. God is doing a new thing in each of our lives. The question then is this: can we see it? Our honest response may range from "No, I don't see it" to "I think I see it, but I'm not sure," or even "what is this 'new thing' in my life that I'm supposed to be seeing?"

The challenge is to be open, ready to listen, ready to surrender to God's love, God's Spirit at work within us. God is doing a new thing in our lives, in our journey of faith. As we gradually open ourselves to that love, God becomes more perceptibly present to us. God often works in the most unexpected ways. We must also be watchful and attentive to those new ways, those new things God is doing in our lives, and to follow them.

Where then do we find these paths that can help us deepen our faith? This retreat will suggest a variety of ways to explore those familiar spiritual journeys and to discover new ways of encountering God during this weekend filled with sacred silence. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin reminds us we are spiritual beings having human experiences, yet we are often unattuned to the truly sacred nature of our lives.

The retreat weekend will offer time for meditative prayer, silence, and conferences to assist us in developing our relationship with God in our everyday lives; in short, a pilgrimage of the heart. The call to discover this new thing God is doing in us is a bold and exciting one; a call that deepens our faith lives. Through prayer, instruction and examination of the mystical nature of our lives, we will walk this journey together as we respond God's beckoning in our spiritual journey.

GENERAL INFORMATION

TIME: Arrival after 3:00 PM Friday. A buffet supper opens the retreat on Friday at 5:45 PM followed by Orientation at 7:00 PM. The retreat closes Sunday about 12:30 PM.

PLACE: North of I-210, Mater Dolorosa is located in the San Gabriel foothills. On its 80 acres, the center has 88 air conditioned rooms (doubles and singles) with private baths, amphitheater, library, gift shop/bookstore, Chapel, outdoor Stations of the Cross and special places of meditation— the Garden of the Seven Sorrows, the Blessed Sacrament Garden, and a mountain waterfall below a meditation pergola overlooking the Los Angeles Basin.

SETTING: Casual dress and comfortable shoes are recommended. Please inform the office in advance if you need a medical diet, wheelchair ramp, or a room for the physically challenged.

COST: The cost of the weekend is \$250 (which includes the \$50 deposit) for the retreat program, two nights' accommodations and five meals. Mater Dolorosa continues its long-standing policy of turning no one away because of financial need to pay for the retreat.
