FAITH: TRUSTING IN THE GOD WHO WAITS FOR YOU


For nearly one hundred years the retreats at Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center have invited participants into a faithful, trusting relationship with the God who waits for us.


Come to the Mountain

A CONVERSATION WITH BOARD MEMBER, TAWFIQ BISHARA

For more than 15 years, Taffy Bishara has found spiritual peace, community, and purpose at Mater Dolorosa. A longtime retreatant, board member, and dedicated volunteer, Taffy describes his connection to this "mountain of God" as something deeper than geography-it is sacred ground.

Originally from Nazareth, Taffy grew up in one of the largest Melkite Catholic families in the Holy Land. Despite the spiritual richness of living near the sites of Jesus' ministry, he shares that the most profound spiritual experience of his life happened not in Jerusalem, but in the quiet stillness of the Mater Dolorosa chapel.

"I was praying about my father, who passed away before I could say goodbye," he recalls. "While reading a book about a mother

and daughter visited by butterflies after losing a loved chapel window was a yellow, spotted butterfly, just like in the book. It was February, and Brother John told me, 'You don't see butterflies here this time of year.' I knew it was a message from God."

Taffy is deeply involved in Mater Dolorosa's leadership, serving on the Board of Directors and the Building & Grounds Committee. He's helped guide key projects, including solar panel installation and facility planning. "Being part of these decisions is a privilege," he says. "Ten years from now, I'll look back and say, 'I was part of that.""


His commitment goes beyond time. A member of the Legacy Society, Taffy has included Mater Dolorosa in his estate plan. "God has blessed me, and I want to give back where I see those blessings at work. I give to Mater Dolorosa because I see the impact-it's used for good." Taffy also helps support others who can't afford to attend retreats. "We want everyone to experience this place, no matter their financial situation. Sometimes people just need a little help—and later, they give back when they can. That's how we build community."

Reflecting on the difference between noisy, crowded holy sites and the peaceful solitude of one, I looked up-and outside the Mater Dolorosa, he says: "The Bible tells us to go to the mountain-Moses went to the mountain, Jesus went to the mountain. Mater Dolorosa is our mountain. It's where we find quiet, prayer, and God's presence."

We are waiting for the last permits to clear the City of Sierra Madre to begin construction! Their permitting process was slowed by the Eaton Fire, but we hope to start construction in fall 2025!

Six months after the Eaton Canyon fire, Mater Dolorosa continues to walk a Journey of Hope under the Shadow of the Cross. Thanks to God's grace and the unwavering support of our community, restoration is well underway. Many visitors have remarked, "It looks like it never even happened"—a testament to the progress we've made.

We've cleared burned brush, trimmed trees, and restored beloved statues, including St. Paul of the Cross, now shining in a renewed Passionist habit. Office repairs are moving forward, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has removed debris. We continue working with insurance and FEMA on long-term recovery, but challenges remain—especially in rebuilding infrastructure and key spaces like the Garden of Seven Sorrows.
